What to include in a eulogy.

- When and where was the deceased born?
- Nicknames and/or names they are known to others by and why.
- Parents names, names of brothers and sisters.
- Early childhood localities and interests.
- Schools attended, awards gained, academic achievements or trade qualifications.
- Some interesting anecdotes or events about childhood days or life experiences.
- Details of any war or military service.
- Marriages, children, grandchildren/great grandchildren, significant relationships.
- Membership of clubs or organisations and positions held.
- Details of sporting achievements, hobbies or interests, travel, crafts etc.
- Events of historical significance.
- Details of activities e.g. music, theatre etc.
- Any special stories, sayings and qualities of significance.
- Special readings, music or poetry to be included.
